Timeline

1491: Henry VIII born

1509: Henry VIII ascends the throne, aged just 17. He marries Catherine of Aragon the same year.

1516: Catherine gives birth to a girl, christened Mary.

1527: The first official request for the annulment of Henry's marriage is sent to the Pope in Rome. It, and subsequent requests, are denied.

[John Taverner - Audivi - c. 1530s]

1531: Henry breaks away from the Pope and creates the Church of England, creating legislation which states that Henry himself will be Supreme Head of the Church.

1533: Anne Bolyn gives birth to a girl, christened Elizabeth.

1536: First Suppression Act. Dissolution of the Monasteries begins.

1537: Jane Seymour gives birth to a boy, christened Edward.

[John Sheppard - In Manus Tuas - c. 1540s]

1547: Henry VIII dies. His son, Edward VI ascends the throne aged 9.

1549: The Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer, introduces a new prayer book 'The Book of Common Prayer', written in English as opposed to Latin.

1550: Thomas Merbecke published his 'Book of Common Praier Noted', which sets the new prayer book to music.

[Thomas Merbecke - Nunc Dimittis - 1550] [Thomas Tallis - If ye Love Me -c. 1552]

1553: Edward dies. Henry's daughter Mary ascends the throne as Queen of England.

1554: Restoration of Roman Catholicism by Mary I.

[Robert White - Christe Qui Lux es et Dies - 1556]

1558: Mary's death. Her half- sister, Elizabeth ascends the throne.

1558: The Act of Supremacy is passed, re-establishing the Church of England's independence from Rome, with Elizabeth as Supreme Governor of the Church of England.

[Thomas Tallis - O Nata Lux and Verily, Verily c. 1560s]

1575: Elizabeth grants Thomas Tallis and William Byrd a 21 year patent to print and publish music in any language they wish.

[William Byrd Mass for 4 voices published as part of the Cantiones Sacrae, 1575] [Thomas Morley- Nolo Mortem Peccatoris - c. 1590s]



Sarah Latto Music Director

In January 2015 the North Downs Consort welcomed our new Music Director Sarah Latto.
Sarah is a young, vibrant choral director, enjoying a blossoming career as a conductor and vocal coach in London and the South Fast.

Sarah read music at Cambridge University, where she held a choral scholarship with Sidney Sussex College,



and completed a BA Hons between 2007 and 2010. She studied conducting with Stephen Layton and performed in masterclasses with Steven Cleobury, John Nethsingha and Timothy Brown, receiving a First for her final year conducting paper. While studying, Sarah founded and conducted the Sidney Sussex Orchestra; a seventy-strong symphony orchestra which continues to thrive under other young conductors.

After graduating in 2010, Sarah continued her conducting studies in Brighton with Deborah Roberts and John Hancorn, where she worked closely with Brighton Early Music Festival as a vocal coach and director, conducted the B.R.E.M.F. Community Choir and lead the B.R.E.M.F. Consort and the B.R.E.M.F. Players in a performance of Monteverdi's Selva Morale e Spirituale.

Sarah was awarded the Association of British Choral Directors bursary scheme for young conductors in 2013-2014, and through the scheme worked with the Royal Opera House Thurrock Community Chorus, a 150- strong chorus. Highlights of the year included conducting the chorus in Mozart and Purcell opera choruses at St. Clement Danes Church as part of the Brandenburg Festival, and preparing the chorus for a performance of Verdi's Requiem in July alongside the Brighton Festival Chorus and the Orchestra de Picardie, with soloists from the Royal Opera House Jette Parker Young Artists programme.

Due to her involvement in the scheme and through singing with the Celestial Sirens, a consort group associated with the Festival, Sarah became particularly interested in music written for and by women. She currently directs Tapestry, a sixteen voice ensemble based in Reading exploring 19th and 20th century repertoire for women's voices. Under her direction, the choir has flourished, and in 2014 performed the UK premiere of Roar Kvam's orchestration of Cesar Franck's Mass in A. Plans for 2015 include a performance of Vaughan-Williams 'Folk Songs of the Four Seasons' with soloists from the Aldworth Philharmonic, and a repeat performance at the Brandenburg Festival.
